SERVICES TO ADULTS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES (STADD) NAVIGATOR SERVICE

STADD offers Navigator services for transitioning youth and their families in many communities across B.C. Navigators act as the primary point of contact for individuals in coordinating transition planning and access to cross-government supports and services through the transition period of 16-24 years old.

STADD transition navigator service is available to patients who have established eligibility for Community Living BC
