PV stands for Human Papillomavirus



HPV is a known cause of many types of cancers and genital warts



Most of us will have HPV at some point in our lives 75% to 90% of the population

## The human papillomavirus (HPV) causes:

almost ALL cases of cervical cancer

40% of vaginal and vulvar cancers

 65-74% of mouth and throat cancers

40-50% of penile cancers

about <mark>80-90%</mark> of anal cancers

HPV is spread through close sexual contact; penetration is not needed to spread the virus

## Did you know?

- HPV vaccination for boys and girls is part of the regular grade 6 immunization program in BC.
- HPV vaccine works best when:
  - the vaccine is given to pre-teens because they have the strongest immune response
  - it is given before exposure to the virus



Ask your Pharmacist, Doctor, Nurse or Public Health Unit about the HPV Vaccine today.



- only 2 doses are needed for 9 14 year olds
- The vaccine is safe and effective. Millions of doses have been given in Canada and worldwide.
- Common reactions to HPV vaccine are similar to other vaccines: pain, redness or swelling in the arm where the injection is given. Sometimes teenagers have fainted when vaccinated.
- Studies show HPV vaccination does not lead to early sexual activity.
